

Starting with just one doctor and one nurse visiting the island one day per week, the service grew quickly and today is now Yulu-Burri-Ba Aboriginal Corporation for Community Health.

Aunty Maureen Myers, one of the early advocates for a culturally safe communitycontrolled health service on the island, and current Director of the Yulu-Burri-Ba board, is proud of the vision, commitment and hard work of everyone involved, and the positive impact for community.

The success of the day reflected the success of our organisation over the past 4 decades.

Elders who have been here since the early days shared stories and laughter over some local fish and salad provided by Perry's Seafood. Our men's shed manned the BBQ, while our staff yarned with community, promoting all the deadly work they do both in and out of our clinics.




Our CEO, David Collins, said the milestone is an opportunity to reflect on and acknowledge the leadership of Elders and what can be achieved through working together.

Since the first clinic in Dunwich Hall on 19 January 1984, the range of services available to the island and southern bayside Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community has expanded to include dental, family wellbeing, Birthing in Our Community, Deadly Choices, women's and men's groups, youth program, and foster and kinship care support.

"Our founding Elders saw that there was a need for these services, and they have been proven correct with the growth of health and welfare services we're now providing to more than 5,000 community members in our region.







Can't get an Appointment?


Forgetting to cancel your appointment if you no longer need it prevents someone else from being seen and means you'll be waiting longer to see your doctor again.




